





A TYPICAL SUNDAY AT CORNERSTONE

Doors open at 8:00 AM for praise and worship rehearsals.

The congregation arrives between 8:30-9:30 AM for an optional time of fellowship before the morning worship service.



After the service, ages 3 - high school meet for Sunday school to learn more about God's word.

A time of fellowship with cookies and coffee follow for all who wish to meet and visit with others.



The worship service begins at 9:30 AM with a time of singing, scripture reading and a sermon - with nursery available for children ages 0-3.

During Sunday morning worship, Children for Christ (C4C) meets for a time of singing, story-telling and crafts, which gives children aged 3-5 an age appropriate Bible lesson.

1. God-centered, spirit-filled Worship
